Chief of Staff:

Responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- Mediating any internal disputes or conflicts, should they arise, and ensuring effective communication and engagement among members of the organization

- Working on any internal or external initiatives that may involve on-campus departments

Responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- Providing leadership and management of the Diversity and Inclusion Committee
- Assigning tasks on initiatives to assist in the completion of the committee's goals
- Facilitating weekly meetings with all committee members
- Serving on any and all task forces/work groups/committees dedicated to improving diversity and inclusivity at Syracuse University
- Working with the President, Vice President, and Cabinet of the Student Association to call attention to under-addressed needs in the community
- Act as student liaison to the university administration on all issues pertaining to diversity and inclusivity
- Introducing initiatives/events for multiple communities, identities, and individuals
- Ensure that all university policies celebrate and recognize diversity and inclusivity
- Creating and overseeing a council of representatives from diverse student organizations to facilitate dialogue and encourage collaboration on campus

- Reviewing existing syllabi policies and implementation
- Working with schools and colleges to standardize the first year forum
